Trees or shrubs are not included. The woodiest plant included is dog rose. Neither are any grasses or nonflowering plants included. Recently introduced plants are only included if established. Annual plants are only included if self seeding. The area looked at is the Byes,.the National Trust land given by Annie Leigh Browne stretching from Sid Lane Bridge to Hearts Delight Bridge either side of the river. and including the plots that came with the Sid Park Road and Salters Meadow developments.

The Lawn is not included but will be the subject of another study
